The Hong Kong Equestrian Federation (formerly the Hong Kong Horse Society) was incorporated on 29th August 1973. Principal activities of the Federation are to promote Equestrian Sports in Hong Kong and to encourage the use and protection

of horses and ponies. Equestrian Sport, as practiced in Hong Kong, comprises three disciplines: Show Jumping, Dressage and Horse Trials.

They are responsible for holding international equestrian sports competitions at both National and International levels. Every four years they organize the Hong Kong participation in Asian Games. HKEF is an affiliated member of Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI), Asian Equestrian Federation (AEF) and Sports Federation & Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China (SF&OC). Facilities in the riding school include offices, lecture rooms, a rest room, changing rooms, horse paddock (95 x 45 m), two pony paddocks (65 x 40 m and 50 x 25 m) and 60 parking spaces, and covered seating areas for BBQs or parties.

Tuen Mun Riding School holds regular shows and competitions for the Federation Equestrian International competitions, HK Pony Club camps and events and RDA events.

Riding School provides these services for Hong Kong Jockey Club Members:

A riding school where students can start from age six with no upper age limit, as long as they are physically fit; livery horses members may rent on a permanent basis; retraining of retired racehorses to become riding horses.

Facilities in the riding school include offices, a rest room, changing rooms, floodlight covered paddock (50 x 30 m), two outdoor sand arenas(130 x 60 m), two smaller sand arenas and grass areas with cross-country jumping fences. There is also a hacking trail in the surrounding hills and through local villages.
