Scheme on Regulation of Disposable Plastic Tableware

The American Chamber of Commerce is one of the largest international business chambers in Hong Kong, and on behalf of our members, is pleased to be able to respond to this important public consultation exercise.

Back in 2014, the Chamber strongly supported government's longer term plans to both reduce waste and for the extension of landfills and to develop Hong Kong's first waste incinerator. Whilst these latter two developments can help buy time for other measures to work, we do feel it is now time to ramp up efforts to increase the reduction of plastic waste into our landfills and to strengthen the circular economy in general.

We want to make our response to Question 2b crystal clear as the wording in English is ambiguous. We support the Regulation Scheme to cover substitutes made of plastic for the tableware defined as the subject of the intended regulation. We do not think "plastic substitutes" in a more general sense should be governed by this regulation, where the substitutes are made of non-plastic substances such as paper, bamboo, etc, for which other arrangements may be necessary.

We are therefore supportive of the proposed Scheme provided that businesses are given adequate time to prepare for the proposed changes and have pleasure in enclosing the Response Form, duly completed. We trust that the government will continue to bring forward additional measures to facilitate both recycling and a reduction in the overall level of municipal solid waste.
